The Water Walk

Thank you for your interest in fundraising and raising awareness for Water First! We truly appreciate your support and are looking forward to seeing the success of your event.

If your school or community is interested in supporting Indigenous communities and access to safe, clean water, a Water Walk fundraising event could be the perfect way to show support.

In support of Water First, an organization that partners with Indigenous communities to support access to safe, clean water, your Water Walk event could raise awareness and funds that will support our programs to continue.

The Water Walk is a fundraising event that engages community members in learning about the water crisis in Indigenous communities, all while raising money through an online fundraising page or collecting cash or cheque donations.

The Water Walk can be done with many participants walking along the same route all at once, or throughout a campaign week on your own time with participants walking the same distance on their own. Whether together or by yourself, we encourage you to create signs and posters to hold while on your walk that can help educate others on the Indigenous water crisis and why you're walking. We also encourage you to document your walk through photos and videos that can be shared on social media.

The Water Walk Checklist

Plan the details

- Pick a date and time
- Decide on whether there will be a planned route for everyone or if participants can walk around their own neighbourhoods individually
- Plan an opening and closing event (guest speaker, finish line, bbq)
- Confirm you guest(s)

Choose how you will fundraise

- Set up an online fundraising through <u>CanadaHelps</u>. (https://waterfirst.ngo/wp-content/uploads/2021/02/CanadaHelps.pdf)
- Use <u>pledge sheets</u> to collect the information of those that donate cash or cheques and would like a tax receipt.

Create awareness for the campaign and silent auction

- Send emails to school staff.
- Send emails to parents and guardians.
- Write up school announcements to promote the event (Examples below).
- Create posters and ads to put up in the school.
- Create posts to be shared on social media.

▲ Gather and create materials

- Awareness posters
- Sun screen
- Weather appropriate clothing

After the event

- After the event, send any cash or cheque donations to:

Announcements

"Did you know that 13.5% of Indigenous communities in Canada are under a boil water advisory? Water First is an organization that is working to address this water crisis in Indigenous communities through education and training programs. "How much water does the average Canadian use each day? About 10 liters, about 50 litres, about 200 litres or about 300 litres? If you guessed 300 litres you are right! This includes washing our hands, washing our dishes and doing our laundry. Can you imagine living in a community where the water wasn't safe to do these things? Well, there are many communities across Canada that deal with this. Water First is an organization that supports access to clean water in Indigenous communities in Canada, so we are holding a Water Walk to try and raise money to reduce the number of communities that face this issue. Dear Parents and Guardians,

Our class has been learning about the significance of safe and clean water and we want to share our learning with you! In Canada, 13.5% of Indigenous communities are under a boil water advisory. In response to that, we are going to hold a fundraiser in support of Water First, an organization that collaborates with Indigenous communities to support access to clean drinking water.
